She talked about rape and murder of women, human trafficking, dowry deaths and forced early marriages. Her talk mainly dealt with contemporary problems. The session proved to be an eye-opener to the student teachers as it portrayed the rather unexplored facets in the lives of women.

12) National Webinar on 'Fundamental Aspects of Constitutional Law' as part of 'Prabuddha- Embracing the New Normal' - Webinar Series, on 19 May 2022

The webinar on 'Fundamental Aspects of Constitutional Law' in association with Centre for Constitutional Literacy, Chiranyinkeezhu was held on 19 May 2022 via Google Meet platform at 6.00 pm. The honourable principal Dr. Sheeba P and Dr. Viji V, Assistant Professor and Staff Advisor of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda were the convenors of the seminar. The Resource Person Dr. Seema S. Dhar gave a general idea about the Indian Constitution like its characteristic features, structure, reason for being the lengthiest constitution in the world and its benefits, difference between Fundamental Rights, Human Rights and Statutory Rights etc. Then her talk focused on the Fundamental Rights mentioned in Article 12-35 of Part III of Indian Constitution and it is also called the Magna Carta of Indian Constitution. She talked about the six fundamental rights enshrined in the Constitution of India which are guaranteed to all citizens irrespective of race, religion, gender and are enforceable by the courts, subject to certain conditions. Throughout the seminar, she preferred to use the term 'stakeholders' instead of 'Government' to instil the power and wider aspects of the Constitution and Fundamental Rights. She also imparted deeper insight on

Writs-the written orders issued by the Supreme Court of India to provide Constitutional remedies to protect the Fundamental Rights of the citizens from violation, Right to Information, significant amendments that were made so far in the Indian Constitution with reference to Kesavananda Bharati case etc. The talk ended with doubt clearance session and feedback from the students.

13) Report on National Webinar on 'Intellectual Property Rights' in association with Centre for Constitutional Literacy, Chirayinkeezhu as part of 'Prabuddha- Embracing the New Normal' - Webinar Series, on 26 May 2022

The College Union 'Anwaya', in collaboration with all the Departments of the college, conducted a National Webinar on the topic 'Intellectual Property Rights' on 26 May 2022, in association with Centre for Constitutional Literacy, Chirayinkeezhu. The resource person was Dr. Lawwellman P., Assistant Professor, Government Law College, Calicut. He provided an informative session for the student teachers about Intellectual Property Rights, which included Patent, Trademark, Industrial designs, Copyright, Semiconductor Chip, Plant variety, Geographical Indications (GI) and Trade Secret and Patent Act 1970. He also emphasised the benefits of Intellectual Property Rights in the modern era. The session was very lively and proved to be richly packed with full-fledged information.

4. CAPABILITY TO DEVELOP A SEMINAR PAPER AND A RESEARCH PAPER; UNDERSTAND/APPRECIATE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO

39) Paper Presentation on 'Life Depletes when Ozone Depletes' in association with Ozone Day on 16 September 2021

As a part of Ozone Day on 16 September 2021, a paper presentation was conducted on the importance of ozone layer protection by Ms. Amritha S. on the topic 'Life Depletes when Ozone Depletes', accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation about the topic. She familiarised ozone, ozone layer and its characteristics, stratosphere etc. She also discussed about the ozone depleting substances like CFC, carbon tetra chloride, methyl bromide etc. She also talked about the discovery of ozone depletion in 1985 by Joe-farman, Brian Gardner, and Jonatshanklin, who, using satellite, balloons and surface stations, discovered a balding patch of ozone in the upper stratosphere. Later, the discussion headed with causes of ozone depletion like man-made causes, industries and natural causes. She discussed the effect on human health by presenting some pictures of skin cancer, cataracts and other eye damages. She also dealt with the effect of ozone depletion on plants. The presentation ended with a relevant warning 'The future is up to all of us'. Ms. Amritha sang a beautiful song as an eye-opener-'Inivarunnoru thalamurakk, ivide vaasam saadhyamo'.

40) Paper Presentation 'Don't let the Future Go up in Smoke' in association with Ozone Day on 17 September 2021

As a part of ozone day, a paper was presented by Mr. Dileesh S. on the topic 'Don't let the future go up in smoke' on 17 September 2021, accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation about the topic. He talked about the prevention of ozone layer depletion and about how we can reduce the use of Ozone Depleting Substances (ODS) like CFC, Halogenated hydrocarbon, methyl bromide, nitrous oxide etc. Mr. Dileesh S. said that we have to use HCFC instead of CFC due to using climate friendly alternatives to replace chlorofluorocarbons which release less chlorine molecules. Later, he discussed the 'preventive measures for ozone layer depletion' like don't use air conditioner or use it less often, open up windows and don't open the refrigerator for too long, get only what you need. don't linger, plant more trees etc. Then he talked about limiting the use of private vehicles. He shared his thoughts on the use eco-friendly household cleaning products. He said that one of the best solutions for Ozone depletion was by conducting awareness programmes at local, regional, national and international levels, formulating policies and authorities should conduct regular inspection of factories to stop the use of CFC in the manufacturing of products. Mr. Dileesh talked about the importance of Kyoto convention (1997 December 11). It stressed the reduction of Ozone depleting substances (ODS). He also talked about the 15th of February Kyoto protocol (2005). He gave additional information about the Clean Air Act (CAA). This was when air pollution first began to be regulated. The act was updated in 1970 and 1990. The programme concluded with an interaction session.



41) Paper Presentation by Ms. Meenu Subhash of Natural Science in Hindi Diwas on 14 September 2021

Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda celebrated Hindi Divas on 14 September 2021 in Google meet platform as a mark of acknowledgement of Hindi as the National Language. The celebration included honouring the guest, Prof. G. Saraswathi, Retd. Professor, S. N. College, Kollam., a song and a paper presentation. The paper was presented by Ms. Meenu Subhash of Natural Science Department regarding the importance of Hindi Diwas Celebration.

42) Paper Presentation on 'We Decide' on 21 March 2022

Health Club of SNTC conducted a paper presentation on 21 March 2022 by Sri. Mohammed Haris T. He explained clearly about down syndrome as a hereditary disease, in which a 21st chromosome is paired with a 21st chromosome pair of mysterious chromosomes in the cells of the human body. He said that it is also known as Trisomy 21 and Trisomy G, and is named after John Langdon Down, a British physician, who first described the condition in 1866. He said that the society should keep such people together and provide shade for their condition. He also added that every member of the society should provide all kinds of care and assistance to these people. The paper indeed proved to be worthy for the entire batch of student teachers.

43) Drishti'- Students' Seminar Series from 6 April 2022 to 7 May 2022

The Department of Educational Philosophy and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda organised and conducted 'Drishti'- Students' Seminar Series from 6 April 2022 to 7 May 2022 in the online mode. It was a 10-day programme which included the presentation and discussion of ten relevant topics from Educational Philosophy. Each day, the session included the energetic participation of students as moderator and speakers. The seminar series gave a wonderful platform for the students to present their ideas, listen to others' diverse perspectives and conduct a healthy discussion on the topics. 1. CAREER AND PERSONAL COUNSELLING

1) International Webinar om 'Time to Shape the Future of Education' on 25 September 2020

Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda, with the collective effort of IQAC and all Departments of the college, conducted an International Webinar on the topic 'Time to Shape the Future of Education' on 25 September 2020. It was part of the webinar series 'Intelligentia beyond Disciplines'. Ms. Urnaib Shamshad, Mentor in New York Academy of Sciences, USA, PGT (Chemistry) in Ministry of Education (UAE) was the resource person. She started the session by showing a picture and stressed the need for teachers to be well equipped with the technological advancement and changing scenario, in order to inspire the children. According to her, the teachers need to change with the changing world in order to motivate the children, by listening to them in achieving their dreams. She added that in order to provide the 21st century skills to students, the teacher should be updated and change the strategy to 'Student Centred Learning', which works in four ways: through personalization of learning, competency-based learning, discovery learning and recognize that learning takes place anytime, anywhere. She emphasised the development of Learning, Literacy and Life skills as the means to acquire these. The discussion session was enriched with the interaction between the resource person and the participants. Both the students and faculty asked questions regarding child centred education, motivating students, difference between the educational systems in India and abroad, the opportunities for Indian students abroad and so on. The resource person explained the queries of the participants well by providing apt responses.

2) Webinar on 'Adyapanathinde Aanandamargam' on 30 October 2020

Sree Narayana Training College Nedunganda organized a webinar on the topic 'Adhyapanathile Ananthamargam' in collaboration with Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on 30 October 2020 through Google Meet. The resource person of the webinar, Sri. Praveen R., Assistant Professor, Sree Narayana Training College, delivered the resource talk by encouraging and inspiring the students to be happy always. He distinguished the two feelings of happiness and joy into meaningful ideas. He described happiness as a choice, and pointed out that success and happiness were inter-connected. 3) National Webinar on 'Online Student Engagement and Support, Teacher Readiness for Challenges and Changes' on 9 October 2020

Sree Narayana Training College, along with IQAC, conducted a webinar on 09.10.2020 on the topic 'Online Student Engagement and Support- Teacher Readiness for Challenges and Changes'. The session was led by Sri. E. K. Jijan, Assistant Professor, Mount Tabor Training College, Pathanapuram, Sri. E. K. Jijan started his presentation about the challenges and issues faced by all teachers in pandemic situation. It included lack of facilities, network issues, audio video issues, societal expectations, parents' satisfaction interference and presence, ensuring engagement, attendance and participation, school and subject differences, stresses etc. He said that there should not be attendance or test compulsion during the pandemic situation. Planning the lessons, poor class management and control, lack of facilities in practicing school, poor method of teaching, ineffective usage of teaching aids, inability to differentiate between the needs of the individual child and supervision were identified as the major problems faced by student teachers. Also, he dealt with the practical strategies to promote student engagement, which included removing unnecessary barriers, change mind sets, give students a voice and a choice, give your students a say, engage first then connect to content, clarify your expectations students are unlikely to succeed if they do not know what is expected of them, provide specific positive and frequent feedbacksmotivation matters, create many opportunities for hands- on learning allow mistakes, use group work and collaboration, encourage students to present and share works regularly. He said that every school, college, and educational institutions use video conferencing, online classes, webinars, Moodle, direct video recording and the use of white, black and digital board etc. Then he talked about the various software that will help us to prepare digital lesson plan including MS Office, Google document, Google slide etc. It was succeeded by the preparation of achievement test and blueprint. SNTC was quite thankful to the resource person for his expertise in the selected area, which reflected in the feedback of students.

4) Awareness Class on 'Women in Leadership- Achieving an equal future in COVID-19 World- Women Safety and Laws' on 8 March 2021

On 8 March 2021, the Women's Club organized an awareness class on the topic 'Women Safety and Laws' in relation to International Women's Day. Adv. Bhavana Chandran of Kollam bar led an interactive session with the student teachers and teacher educators.

5) Training Programmes on Entrepreneurship Marketing in the Digital Age, Preparation of Eco friendly materials, Preparation of cleaning lotion using Swadeshi Products, Webinar on 'Ayurveda and Immunity Boosting Measures for Self-Care'

The Entrepreneurship club began its programmes on 27 March 2021 with a Training Programme on 'Entrepreneurial Marketing in Digital Age' sponsored by the Department of Industries and Commerce, Government of Kerala. The Training Programme was conducted by Mr. Praveen Calvin, Founder of Cazol Web Consulting & Calzol Centre for Research and Business. Mr. Praveen Calvin talked about the ability of marketing companies to track the needs of people based on their updates on social media and their involvement in selling the



identities of people to marketing firms. He talked about the ways in which we can be a successful entrepreneur like sales, marketing, choosing the right social media platforms, technological update, finding products, tracking sales, earning commissions, and joining affiliate. He then elaborated on the importance of technology in marketing by showing videos of various robots used in different scenarios. He then showed the video of a supermarket that was able to operate automatically. The most interesting video was the one with a group of plants talking to humans about what they need with the help of technology. The session proved to open a wide range of opportunities in customizing online marketing before a student teacher to start as well as maintain a YouTube channel or start an online teaching platform which will surely be an asset in future life. The Entrepreneurship club trained the student teachers on 27 March 2021 to prepare eco-friendly materials since the principal focus of Sree Narayana Training College is on sustainable development. The college encouraged to produce eco-friendly materials as it is biodegradable and non-harmful to the society. The programme was sponsored by Department of Industries and Commerce, Government of Kerala. Mrs. Geethakumari N, Teacher of Aiswarya Public School, Kalakkode was the resource person. Smt. Geetha started to train the student teachers on cloth bag preparation by giving the materials to them. Then she explained paper bag production using eco-friendly materials. The student teachers immediately prepared two hundred paper bags. Then, she taught the students the making of handwash. The session proved to improve the vocational skill of the student teachers which may become an asset in their future journey. Student teachers were really enriched with the knowledge of preparation of several items with swadeshi products.

Also, a webinar was organized by the IQAC of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda on 6 May 2021, on the topic 'Ayurveda and Immunity Boosting Measures for self-care during Covid-19 crisis' as second part of Webinar series 'Intelligentia Beyond Disciplines- Cross Disciplinary Collaboration in Education'. S. and Mr. Dileesh S. were the moderators. There were 12 participants, and they were divided into team of 6. Dr. Dhanya B. Chandran (Assistant Professor, SNTC) was the judge for the debate. Based on the performance, 4 finalists were chosen- Sajin Dev S., Muhammed Haris T., Abhina and Akhila. They were given the topic 'Is Encroachment of Technology in our dayto-day life a blessing or curse?'. Each one of them were given 4 minutes- 2 to argue for and 2 to argue against. After the competition, Dr. Dhanya declared Muhammed Haris T. from the Dept. of Social Science as the Best Debater. Ms. Abhina from the Dept. of Malayalam was awarded the second position. On 28.02.2021, a Quiz competition was conducted. A team of 3 members participated from each department. It was moderated by Ms. Sruthy S. Pillai. Ms. Dhanya B. and Ms. Aiswarya T. recorded the marks scored by each team. The first round was on basic science and the quizmaster was Ms. Swathy J. P. Each team was asked one question each. The correct answers on first attempt were awarded 5 marks and pass questions were given 3 marks. The second round was riddle round carried out by Ms. Sreelekshmi M. S. Each team was asked one question each and marking was similar to first round. The third round was an audio-visual round and quizmaster was Ms. Pooja J. B. An audio and a visual of famous personalities were to be identified by the participants. Marking was same as the first two rounds. Based on the total marks scored at the end of third round, 3 teams were selected for the finals. The final round was a rapid fire round conducted by Ms. Megha. Each team was allotted 30 seconds and each correct answer was awarded 5 marks. At the end, team Natural Science (Ms. Amrutha Prakash, Mr. Sumith and Ms. Anagha) bagged the first position with 25 points. Team English (Ms. Avani V. R., Ms. Meenu M. J., Ms. Athira Jayakumar) won the second position.

17) International Women's Day Programmes from 1 to 8 March 2021

The Women's Study Unit of Sree Narayana Training College organized International Women's Day 2021 with a series of programmes. On 1 March 2021 a Collage Making Competition and on 2 March 2021, a Caption Writing Competition were held by the club. On 3 March 2021, a Story Writing Competition was held in the college and on 4 March 2021, a Debate Competition on 'Kulastreekalum Chattakoodukalum' was held. It was organized as an inter-optional competition. Dr. Dhanya B. Chandran, Assistant Professor of Sree Narayana



Training College evaluated the various competitions and the winners were presented prizes on International Women's Day 2021. On 5 March 2021, a recreational game activity 'Pop the Balloon' programme was organized for the students by the club members. On 8 March 2021, a seminar was organized on the topic 'Women and Legal Issues'. Advocate Bhavana Chandran of Kollam Bar Association was the resource person. The session included a thematic presentation and interactive session.

18) SUPW Exhibition and Food Fest on 20 March 2021

The College Union conducted an exhibition on SUPW and art works on 20 March 2021. SUPW materials included the teaching learning materials, books prepared by the pages they teared from old ones. The paper made by the students using newspaper waste was also shown in the exhibition. The importance of recycling and minimalization were made aware to the student teachers through the SUPW exhibition. The student teachers also understood the production of different materials which they sometimes left without considering its value. Indeed this exhibition developed their aesthetic talents as well as creative capacity. Along with this, a Food Fest was also arranged with traditional multi-course vegetarian meal of Kerala, Sadhya, Chinese dishes and nadan tattukada. It was a fine learning experience for the student teachers. This helped the students to learn teamwork, collaboration and creativity.

19) Webinar on Art Education on 5 December 2020

Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda organized a webinar on Art Education on 5 December 2020 in the online platform, Google Meet. The resource person was Ms. Veena M. B., dance instructor at Attingal Progressive Arts Club, and an Alumni of the college. Ms. Veena M. B. started her talk by sharing the influence the B.Ed. course had in her life. She defined art as the expression or application of human creative skill and imagination and discussed briefly on various branches of art like painting, music, literature, dance etc. She also mentioned ancient texts like Ardhasasthra, Natyasasthra, Bhagawatam, Mahabharatam, which contained details of nearly 64 art forms existed in Puranic Bharat. Then she discussed two types of art forms-sukumarakalakal and upayogakalakal with examples. Then, Ms. Veena defined art education as the set of instructions on how to use the language of art. She also added that everyone is unique and encouraged the student teachers to find the talent in them and make use of it in their teaching practice. She briefed on teaching through music, dance etc. Then she detailed on single hand gestures and double hand gestures and winded up her talk by showing it. The 45-minute resource talk was followed by an interactive session. In this, she briefed on her teaching experience in teaching mathematical theorems through Ottan Thullal and the response she received from her students.

20) Resource Talk on BURNING LIPS TO DARING LIFE in connection with World No Tobacco Day, on 31 May 2021

Sree Narayana Training College, in relation to Anti-tobacco day, organised a Resource Talk on BURNING LIPS TO DARING LIFE by Dr. Salini V. S., Consultant Scientist, Institution for Rural Development, Thiruvananthapuram, organised by 'Aagneyam'- College Union,



SNTC, in connection with World No Tobacco Day, on 31 May 2021. Also, Fun Video Making, Story Writing, Essay Competition, Elocution and Intercollegiate logo creation competition were organized and conducted by Health Club on 31.05.2021. Fun video making had a theme of anti-tobacco ideology, 'Burning thoughts on smoky lips' for story writing, 'Heal or wheel- ciggies you decide' for essay writing competitions etc. Also for elocution competition, 'Substance abuse and new generation' was the topic. Brochures of these competitions were circulated among various WhatsApp groups. The entries were collected by a WhatsApp group which was started for this purpose. Winners were given certificates.

3. COMMUNICATING WITH PERSONS OF DIFFERENT DISABILITIES: BRAILLE, SIGN LANGUAGE AND SPEECH TRAINING

21) Institutional Visit – Light to Blind School on 3 August 2020

As a part of the B.Ed. curriculum, senior students of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda visited the institution of special residential school for visually challenged children on 3 August 2020. This school was located at Sivagiri, Varkala. This institutional visit provided the student teachers new learning opportunities and welcomed them to know more about the learning materials of inclusive students, learning strategies, their abilities to reduce prejudices and strengthen social integration of teaching. The faculty in the school taught the college students the various learning aids used for children in the inclusive classrooms. It enabled the students teachers in getting adequate knowledge and provided them innovative experiences that integrated inclusive education and children associated with it in realising their right to education and the need to transform the whole education system, while incorporating qualities needed for the student teachers in working and learning in an inclusive environment.

4) CAPABILITY TO DEVELOP A SEMINAR PAPER AND A RESEARCH PAPER; UNDERSTAND/APPRECIATE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO

22) Paper Presentation on "Perseverance Rover" on 23rd February 2021

On the second day of science day celebrations 2021, on 23 February 2021, a paper presentation on 'PERSEVERANCE ROVER' was carried out by Ms. Darsana Prakash of Physical Science Department. Ms. Darsana Prakash briefly described about this mission of NASA on Mars to study about its atmosphere, to check the presence of water, habitat and so on. She explained it as a mission for 10 years and as equipped with machineries to collect nearly 30 samples from there, and that it landed on Jezero Crater. She also added that the landing section of this mission was controlled by Ms. Swati Mohan, an Indian American Scientist. It was a 10-minute presentation and really informative and interesting.

5. E-CONTENT DEVELOPMENT

Webinar Series- 'Technoid: Dreams Come True' from 11 March 2021 to 20 May 2021

IT Club of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda organised a webinar series Technoid: Dreams Come True in five sessions for increasing the knowledge of the students in technical skills. The webinar series started from 11 March 2021 and ended by 20 May 2021. The first session in the series was handled by Dr. Lakshmi A., Assistant Professor in Education, N.S.S. Training College, Pandalam. The session discussed topics like Kahoot, Quizizz and other evaluation tools. In the second session, the resource person was Dr. George Varghese, Assistant Professor in Education, Mount Tabor Training College, Pathanapuram. That session was meant for the explanation of blog creation, video creation and multimedia applications like Jamboard. The third session of the webinar was intended to give an idea regarding e-learning and e- content development. 6. ONLINE ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING

24) Webinar on 'Preparing Tools to Assess Learner's Performance'

Sree Narayana Training College conducted an online resource talk on the topic 'Preparing Tools to Assess Learners' Performance' on 14 July 2020 via Google Meet. Dr. Smitha S., Assistant Professor of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda was the resource person of the programme. The talk explained the different Tools and Techniques for Evaluation of learners' performance. projects, case study, assignments, worksheets, seminars and reports. The session was an informative one for all the student teachers to enrich their technical skills.

25) Online Examination (Internal)

The teachers also monitored the examination through google meet and the students attended the examination by opening their camera in a mute mode. 1. CAREER AND PERSONAL COUNSELLING

1) International Yoga Day on 21 June 2019

Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda celebrated the International Day of Yoga on 21 June 2019 by organizing a State Level Seminar on Yogic Sciences. The seminar highlighted the theme of international yoga day 2019 'Yoga with Gurus'. Dr. A. Shershah, Associate Professor and HOD, Department of Physical Education, TKM Arts and Science College, Kollam, was the Resource Person and he delivered a talk on 'Relevance of Physical Fitness among College Students'. In his words, "Yoga is an invaluable gift from our ancient tradition.



It embodies the unity of mind & body, thought, and action, a holistic approach that is valuable to our health & well-being. It is not only exercise but also the way to discover the senses of oneness with you, the world and nature". The audience got more valuable information about the rich therapeutic aspects of Yoga for their personal fitness and mental health among student teachers. The next session was presentation of research papers by invited research scholars. There were participants from Arts and Science Colleges, Engineering Colleges and Nursing Colleges. Many scholastic works on the benefits of Yoga were presented. Dr. Deepu P. R. was the judge for the session. The best three papers were acknowledged with First, Second and Third prizes.

2) Entrepreneurship Awareness Programme on 16 August 2019

5) Programme on the 'Success Stories of Blooming Entrepreneurs' on 10 January 2020

On 10 January 2020, the Entrepreneurship Development Cell organized a programme on 'Success Stories of Blooming Entrepreneurs'. The programme provided a rare opportunity to the student teachers to know, share and get inspired with the real-life stories of successful entrepreneurs. Besides this, the student teachers who were engaged in any form of entrepreneurial ventures out of their passion, shared their experiences. This proved to be a real motivation for all students to pursue their interests.

6) Session on Soft Skill Development on 8 January 2020

A session on Soft Skill Development was conducted by Dr. Sangeetha N. R., Assistant Professor, Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda on 08 January 2020 as a part of capacity development programme. The session was meant for enhancing the performance of prospective teachers. This was an effective session for the student teachers to develop interpersonal skills, communication skills, listening skills, time management, leadership quality, empathy etc. The class helped the prospective teachers to improve their interpersonal relationships which they practiced during their usual class and practice teaching sessions. The session ended with a formal vote of thanks after the discussions.

7) Activities in connection with Bridge Courses

Bridge courses help the students to cope up with the transition from one course to a new course. Sree Narayana Training College is very cautious about the mental health of the students. So, a bridge course was conducted for the prospective teachers as they enter a professional course directly from the Arts and Science College, expecting the same routine in this course also. Bridge course was conducted by the teacher educators for the student teachers during the first week of admission to the course. In this session, the students were made aware about the values and expectations of a society from teachers. The bridge course also provided them with the necessary routine to be followed in the college from the morning assembly which included thought for the day, news reading, familiarizing the difficult and new words both in English and Malayalam, class hours and its norms, the syllabus, way of internal and external practical examination, scoring of marks in each semester, their internal work, teaching practice, community living camp, study tours etc. The session proved to provide awareness about the importance and responsibilities rested on the student teachers and the roles they have to fulfil in society.

8) Yoga and Meditation

Sree Narayana Training College, in association with Department of Physical Education, conducted yoga and meditation session in the college throughout the year in order to raise the good health, mental hygiene, emotional stability, moral values, higher level of consciousness among the student teachers. This proved to be highly useful in handling the classes in their practice teaching schools and future teaching fields. Yama, niyama, asana, prananyama,

9) Remedial Coaching

A personal remedial programme was organized by Sree Narayana Training College in association with all Departments in order to give remedial individualized instruction to the needy students. From the class tests and midterm tests, teachers get an awareness about the academic achievement of the students. As academic achievement is inevitable for the progression of student teachers, the entire teaching faculty of the college focuses on the performance of the students while writing examination and based on it, the teachers pick the students who require individual attention for different reasons. Accordingly, classes are arranged in the morning and evening time to give immense training in the subjects by considering the weak areas for them. This practice of providing remedial coaching sessions proved to be a success in University Examination as well as for qualifying the Competitive examinations.

10) Personal Counselling and Mentoring

Mentor Teaching is proved to be a successful one in the history of Sree Narayana Training College. As a usual procedure, from the starting of a semester itself, the teachers divide the entire newly arrived candidates into ten different groups with an intention to provide personal counselling and mentoring throughout the year. The mentoring process includes the guidelines for the talent hunt, individualized guidance and counselling process for different matters including education and vocation etc. This is proved to be effective in the life of every mentee to be able to face the challenging situations in life.

11) National Legal Awareness Programme on 7 March 2020

Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda organised a one-day National Level Legal Awareness Programme sponsored by National Commission for Women (NCW), Govt. of India on 7 March 2020. As per the direction of NCW, the two laws selected for discussion were Family Law- Marriage & Divorce and Cyber Law. The seminar was inaugurated by Sri. V. Sasi, Honourable Deputy Speaker of Kerala Legislative Assembly. He stressed the importance of organizing the Legal Awareness Programmes in order to enable women and girls to know their legal rights and to understand the procedure and method of access to the legal systems. He emphasized that the primary mandate of the National Commission for Women is to seek justice for women, safeguard their rights, and promote women's empowerment. Adv. Supriya Devayani, introduced the theme 'Women and Indian Constitution' through an excellent talk by giving an overview of the existing laws and

constitutional provisions to protect women. The theme of the first technical session was 'Family Law- Marriage & Divorce' by Shri. Dr. Alexander Jacob I.P.S., D.G.P. Kerala (Rtd.). He highlighted the importance of family and said that inadequate education or no education is the most important factor contributing to the backwardness of our masses, especially women which brings down the national literacy and the session discussed many issues related to Marriage, Hindu Law on Marriage and Divorce, Muslim Law on Marriage and Divorce, Christian Law on Marriage and Divorce, The Parsi Marriage and Divorce Act, 1936, The Special Marriage Act, 1954, Adoption Cases, Conditions for a Valid Marriage, Procedure for Remedy etc. The theme of the second technical session was 'Cyber Law' and issues related to Cybercrimes. The Cyber Cell, Kerala arranged two eminent cyber experts Sri. Anil Kumar, Sub Inspector, and Sri. Adheen Asok, cyber experts, Cyber Cell, Kerala. The Resource Persons shared many case studies from the real experiences and remedies from their expertise as they do deal with several cases every day. They discussed a number of anecdotes related to Cyber Crimes against Women, Harassment through e-mails, Cyber stalking, Child pornography, Cyber bullying, and Cyber grooming. The session was also very much fruitful to the audience as the resource persons suggested many procedures for remedies and measures for online safety from the real-life contexts. Thirty-one papers were also presented in paper presentation sessions. The programme was well attended by the delegates from different colleges of various Universities in Kerala; academicians, research scholars, U.G. & P.G. students from different Law and Arts and Science colleges. The presence of members from different Self-Help Groups in the local area was the major attraction of the Programme.

a) Academic Aspects

12) Seminar on 'Moulding Prospective Teachers' as part of Bridge Course on 08 July 2019

Praveen R., Assistant Professor in Malayalam, on 14 June 2019. He gave a detailed, yet simplified knowledge on the ten verses in it. The correct meaning and values hidden in the words of Narayana Guru was detailed by him. He also gave a brief history of Sree Narayana Guru and the background of writing the prayer. He clarified the doubts of students during the interactive session. This interactive and informative programme helped the students to dive into the in-depth essence of Daivadasakam.

18) Retreat on 21 July 2019

The Retreat Programme 2019 of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda was conducted on 21 July 2019. The programme was conducted for the first year students for exposing their hidden talents. The teachers of the college also took part in the session. It was an ice-breaking session for the first year students for reducing their stage fright and tension. 20) National Science Day Celebrations from 26 to 28 February 2020

National Science Day 2020 was celebrated in the college from 26 February 2020 to 28 February 2020 in a befitting manner. The programme was convened by Dr. Viji V., Assistant Professor in Physical Science. The student teachers of the college actively participated in the programme. A Scientist Impersonation programme was conducted as a part of Science Day Celebrations on 26 February 2020. The resource person of the seminar was Sri. Sarath, a Higher Secondary teacher at MGM Model School, Varkala, and a former student of Sree Narayana Training College. He started the session by talking about the present-day life span of man and explained about the importance of ozone layer to mankind. 4. <u>CAPABILITY TO DEVELOP A SEMINAR PAPER AND A RESEARCH PAPER; UNDERSTAND/APPRECIATE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO</u>

29) Paper Presentation on 'Ozone Day and the Importance of Protecting Ozone Layer' on 26 July 2019

The Nature Club of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda, conducted a paper presentation on 'Ozone day and the Importance of protecting Ozone Layer' on 26 July 2019. The resource person was Ms. Neeni. The aim of the session was to spread awareness to make the young minds understand about the importance of ozone layer and the need to protect this fragile shield of gas. Through PowerPoint Presentation, the students were apprised that ozone layer is a natural part of our atmosphere and that it shields the earth from most of the sun's harmful ultraviolet radiations. UV rays could be very damaging for our planet- for plants, humans and animals. The students were also sensitised that as a result of ozone depletion, there will be increase in earth temperature, melting of glaciers, cancerous diseases and rise in the level of ocean and many more. Active and energetic participation of students was observed throughout the session. On the whole, it was a creative and interesting session, which enlightened the students and made them realise the seriousness of the situation.

30) Paper Presentation on 'Sustainable Development Goals' on 12 August 2019

A seminar on 'Sustainable Development Goals' was held in the college on 12 August 2019. The seminar was attended by the first year and second year students of SNTC. The resource person was Mr. Kiran who presented the paper well. The seminar focused on the goals related to the social sectors, including health and sanitation, safety nets, poverty alleviation, and their relevance in the Indian context. The presentation compared the growth, TFP and achievements of the Millennium Development Goals made in other countries, such as China,





Poland, Nepal, Pakistan, Bangladesh, and differences in inter-state patterns within India. The challenges in the assessment of SDGs, such as the availability of less data, were also highlighted. He stressed the importance of the self-governing systems and that it needs to be enhanced. According to him, the micro level enhancement is the need of the time. Finally, he acknowledged that students are the reservoir of energy in every context, especially in the context of sustainable development. His session ended with an interesting and enriching Question & Answer session.

31) Paper Presentation on 'Skill based education' on 17 January 2020

The IT Club Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda, organized a paper presentation on the topic 'Skill Based Education'. The paper presentation was led by Ms. Neethu M. G. on 17 January 2020. The session started at 11.00 am and the presentation lasted for 2 hours. The resource person covered such areas as the situation of skill-based education in India, and the reason for it to be considered as a vocational skill obtained through short-term training or courses, rather than a part of the formal education sector. 5. E-CONTENT DEVELOPMENT

33) Resource Talk on E-content Development on 25 February 2020

The class was taken by Dr. George Varghese, Assistant Professor in Education, Mount Tabor Training College, Pathanapuram. 3) Career Orientation Programmes organized by IQAC & Career Guidance and Placement Bureau of the college

Career Guidance and Placement Bureau of the college organized several inspiring and educative programmes throughout the year. It offered vocational guidance activities and provided opportunities for vast reading. Weekly General Knowledge Programme was conducted, which was highly beneficial for the students in equipping them to face the competitive examinations confidently. The winners were awarded with prizes every week as an encouragement. The Extempore Speech organized by the club really served as a platform for the students for expressing their views on a general social issue and for enriching their public speaking skill. 'Seminar on Online Courses' was conducted on 14.09.2018. This served as a digital knowledge platform for equipping the student teachers to travel in tune with the digital era. Online Examination Orientation organized for senior batch students helped in reducing exam anxiety and provided guidance to the students regarding the necessity of proper planning, preparing, and managing time for examinations and to prepare for online examination. Subscription of 'Thozilvartha' was very much beneficial to the students. The Inter Optional Quiz Competition conducted by the club was highly inspiring and encouraging in order to generate enthusiasm among student teachers. The club continuously served as a placement agent to our students by providing proper vocational awareness and conscientization activities on the existing educational situations. These proved to be worthy for the students to raise their vocational skills in future endeavours.

4) Pre-placement orientation programme and Felicitation to NET, SET, TET holders on 30 April 2019

Online Examination Orientation organized for Senior batch students by Career Guidance and Placement Bureau of the College helped in reducing examination anxiety and provided guidance to the students regarding the necessity of proper planning, preparing and managing time for examinations and to prepare for online examination. During this year, out of the outgoing batch of ninety-one (91) students, sixty-two (62) cleared and qualified competitive



examinations including NET/SET/TET. Career Guidance Bureau organized a warm felicitation function on 30.04.2019 to these students. This programme was extended to a preplacement orientation programme in which Dr. R. Raveendran, UGC Emeritus Professor & Former Principal, S.N. College, Sivagiri delivered the resource talk. 5) Personal Counselling and Mentoring

Personal counselling and mentoring by mentor teachers is a notable benefit of Sree Narayana Training College. 23) Aids Day on 1 December 2018

All the student teachers and faculty members wore red ribbons to raise awareness about AIDS. At the end of the programme, the students pledged to remain away from this disease and follow all the useful instructions.

24) Awareness Programmes conducted by the Energy Club

An Optional wise Performance-based Competition on 'Energy Conservation' was organised by the Energy Club of the college, where the student teachers needed to express the theme of Energy Conservation in any of the performance-based art forms. The programme witnessed creative activities performed by the students. All the optional subjects exhibited enchanting performances in the form of mimes, speeches, skits and dance drama, conveying the message of energy conservation in a skilful manner. The programme provided students with the opportunity to engage the mind, the body and emotions into a collaborative expression of all that it means to be human. Through this, the students explored and presented the theme in an innovative manner. Mathematics optional bagged the first prize for their performance through creative dance drama. An Inter-Optional Quiz Competition on Energy Conservation, in connection with the Ozone Day celebrations was conducted in the college in collaboration with the Energy Club. The student teachers of all the optional subjects participated enthusiastically in the quiz competition. The first prize was secured by Mathematics optional students, the second prize by the Physical Science optional students and third prize by the English optional students. A Community Survey on Energy Literacy and a Conscientisation Session was conducted in the locality of the college on 03 October 2019. In an age when the effects of poor energy management and pollution are beginning to be felt with increasing intensity, it is urgent to make efforts to empower people and bring them to change their energy consumption habits. So the survey was intended to examine the extent of understanding of the people of the locality on the nature and role of energy in their daily lives. The main objective of the survey was to assess the levels of energy knowledge, sensitivity to the need to adopt energy-saving behaviours and citizens' energy decisions, or by assessing financial and investment knowledge applied to energy issues. It also focused on getting feedback and collecting the opinion from the residents in the community about energy conservation. The people of the locality participated enthusiastically in the survey and shared their views. It was found that the levels of energy literacy of the people were low. This was attributed mainly due to their lack of commitment to energy saving. This was followed by a



Conscientisation Session, through which the people were made aware of the need to conserve energy and make wise use of it. The session could make a positive influence on the energy literacy levels in people. It also made people capable enough to make the best energy-related decisions in future.

25) Training programme on the preparation of Swadeshi products such as washing powder and toilet lotion

Gandhi club of SNTC organized an training session and a workshop on preparation of cleaning lotion and washing powder with a view to create an environment of hygiene and cleanliness in college campus and make the students self-efficient in their daily life. 3. COMMUNICATING WITH PERSONS OF DIFFERENT DISABILITIES: BRAILLE, SIGN LANGUAGE AND SPEECH TRAINING

28) Institutional Visit to C.H. Mohammed Koya Memorial State Institute for Mentally Challenged on 4 July 2018

As part of the curricular activities during the academic year 2018-'19, the faculty and students of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda had an institutional visit to C.H. Mohammed Koya Memorial State Institute for Mentally Challenged (SIMC) on 4 July 2018. SIMC is an autonomous society registered on 23 December 1995 under the charitable society's Registration Act, 1995. SMIC has its headquarters at Pangappara and is governed by a general council and an executive council. The minister in charge of General Education is the chairman and Secretary, General Education is the vice chairman. The institution provides services like special school and hostel, vocational training centre, diploma courses, early intervention unit, physiotherapy, occupational theory, speech therapy, parents training programmes, library, curriculum training for special teachers etc.

As part of B.Ed. curriculum, inclusive education is an inevitable topic to be imbibed and hence, the college conducted an institutional field visit to SIMC for gaining first-hand experience. Of the core objectives of SIMC, the provision for vocational education has prime importance and the institute offers various kind of skill and competencies development programmes according to their capabilities. The student teachers had a good interactive session with the talented little souls there and got a vivid idea of their behaviours, routines, aptitudes, skills etc. The facilities and care provided by the authorities and staff were worth mentioning. Considering the privacy concerns of the disabled students, photography and videography were strictly prohibited inside SIMC's premises. The institutional visit was a nice experience as it paved the way for better insight of student teachers about differently abled students and institutions functioning for their welfare.

4. <u>CAPABILITY TO DEVELOP A SEMINAR PAPER AND A RESEARCH PAPER; UNDERSTAND/APPRECIATE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO</u>

29) Presentation of papers by students on the 'Various projects executed by KSEB for energy conservation' by Energy Club of the College on 15 November 2018

A paper presentation was conducted on 'Various Projects executed by KSEB for Energy Conservation' on 15 November 2018. Ms. Sholi L. K. of Physical Science optional presented a paper on the various projects executed by KSEB for energy conservation. Following this, Mr. Manu J. of English optional presented a paper on the 'SOURA Project', which is a subsidy scheme put forward by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE). In line with the phase II subsidy program of MNRE and with the approval of state government, KSEB initiated the subsidy program for our domestic consumers. In this subsidy initiative, KSEB introduce three special models (Kerala models) apart from the normal subsidy model. All three Kerala models are based on the average consumption of the consumer and it aims to

5. E-CONTENT DEVELOPMENT

31) Workshop on E-Content Development on 3 October 2018

As a part of B.Ed. curricular activities in the year 2018, a workshop on e-content development was conducted at Sree Narayana Training College Nedunganda on 3 October 2018. Smt. Chitra S., Assistant Professor of SNTC, Nedunganda was the resource person of the programme. E- content development was an important topic in the general paper 'Technology and Communication in Education'. To provide a comprehensive and in-depth knowledge and understanding on e-content development- concept and practical aspects, the resource person taught various tools and techniques involved in e-content development with special mention to ADDIE model. 1. CAREER AND PERSONAL COUNSELLING

Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda organised a resource talk on 'Green Chemistry' by Kerala State Council for Science and Technology and Environment on 28



February 2018. Resource talk was presented by Dr. Shibi I. G, Retd. Professor, Sree Narayana College, Kollam. The session enhanced the awareness of student teachers to incorporate the efficient use of Green Chemistry in the field of education and to pass on to generations for a sustainable tomorrow. Vote of thanks was done by Keerthana from the Department of Natural Science.

11) Resource Talks organized on 'Alternative Education and its present significance' on 11 December 2017

Union of the College on 11 December 2017 conducted a resource talk on 'Alternative Education and its present significance'. The talk was conducted by the National Child Artist Winner of 2012, Sri Minon. He well explained the need for alternative education in the society and condemned for the strict curriculum followed in the schools and college without considering the natural capacity of the students. As per his words, it was certainly a cheating over a child, not to allow him to develop his natural potentialities. The student teachers quite appreciated the seminar by engaging and clarifying the doubts with the resource person.

13) Resource Talk on 'Learning through Magic' on 10 February 2018

A resource talk was organized on 'learning through magic' by the department of Physical Science on 10.02.2018. The resource person was Sri Haris Taha, magician and environmentalist. Welcome address was done by Mr. Arocki A and the magician opened an enchanting class before the audience. Even if the science students knew how the reactions happen, they were also amazed by the performance of the magician. The entry of the magician was also a captivating one, as he entered by making cracking sound in the floor.



The cracking sound was made by potassium iodide in ammonium hydroxide and the crack only occurs when one applies pressure on it. The notable ones were the bleeding from the hands as a knife touch on the hands, due to the reaction of ferric chloride with potassium thiocyanate. Likewise, he turned clean water into milk by the chemical reaction of passing of carbon dioxide gas through lime water. He first made astonishment in the face of audience by showing the magic and later explained the reactions of chemistry behind in a simple way. This resource talk led the science students to find out an innovative method of teaching by themselves. It was a highly useful session for the entire prospective teachers.

b) Technical Aspects

14) Inauguration of blog creation organised by Entrepreneurship Club on 27 August 2017
