



One casle One religion One god.



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
Objective


Requirements

for the making of this mat, we need sopes, used old clothes of 200 colour, threads of the same colour as that of the dothes and a needle to sew between the ropes.



Procedure

Tixely the dothes are torn in equal length and are arapped around the ropes. They wrapped tightly around the rope in such a manner that the ropes are not visible outside. The clothes taken here are ob white and red. The white and the red clothes are wrapped around the ropes.



the threads taken here are also of seed and white so that it matches with the about of the crothes and the stitching are not visible easily. The sed and while clothes are wrapped asound the sopes and are kept aside clot the next step. Fax the mext step, the rope wrapped in white dothe is taken and is bent in such a way that it clorms to concentric circles and they are sticked togetheor with while thread using the next so that the concentric circles made out of the rope stays there and doesn't loosen by chemselves. 

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


