5) EXECUTING/ CONDUCTING THE EVENT

• <u>Paper Presentation on 'Life Depletes when Ozone Depletes', in connection with</u> <u>World Ozone Day</u>

As a part of Ozone Day on 16 September 2021, a paper presentation was conducted on the importance of ozone layer protection by Ms. Amritha S. on the topic 'Life Depletes when Ozone Depletes', accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation about the topic. She familiarised ozone, ozone layer and its characteristics, stratosphere etc. She also discussed about the ozone depleting substances like CFC, carbon tetra chloride, methyl bromide etc. She also talked about the discovery of ozone depletion in 1985 by Joe-farman, Brian Gardner, and Jonatshanklin, who, using satellite, balloons and surface stations, discovered a balding patch of ozone in the upper stratosphere. Later, the discussion headed with causes of ozone depletion like man-made causes, industries and natural causes. She discussed the effect on human health by presenting some pictures of skin cancer, cataracts and other eye damages. She also dealt with the effect of ozone depletion on plants. The presentation ended with a relevant warning 'The future is up to all of us'. Ms. Amritha sang a beautiful song as an eyeopener- 'Inivarunnoru thalamurakk, ivide vaasam saadhyamo'.

• <u>Paper Presentation on 'Don't Let the Future Go Up in Smoke, in connection</u> with World Ozone Day

As a part of ozone day, a paper was presented by Mr. Dileesh S. on the topic 'Don't let the future go up in smoke' on 17 September 2021, accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation about the topic. He talked about the prevention of ozone layer depletion and about how we can reduce the use of Ozone Depleting Substances (ODS) like CFC,





Halogenated hydrocarbon, methyl bromide, nitrous oxide etc. Mr. Dileesh S. said that we have to use HCFC instead of CFC due to using climate friendly alternatives to replace chlorofluorocarbons which release less chlorine molecules. Later, he discussed the 'preventive measures for ozone layer depletion' like don't use air conditioner or use it less often, open up windows and don't open the refrigerator for too long, get only what you need, don't linger, plant more trees etc. Then he talked about limiting the use of private vehicles. He shared his thoughts on the use eco-friendly household cleaning products. He said that one of the best solutions for Ozone depletion was by conducting awareness programmes at local, regional, national and international levels, formulating policies and authorities should conduct regular inspection of factories to stop the use of CFC in the manufacturing of products. Mr. Dileesh talked about the importance of Kyoto convention (1997 December11). It stressed the reduction of Ozone depleting substances (ODS). He also talked about the 15th of February Kyoto protocol (2005). He gave additional information about the Clean Air Act (CAA). This was when air pollution first began to be regulated. The act was updated in 1970 and 1990. The programme concluded with an interaction session.

<u>Awareness Programme on World Aids Day by Natural Science Association</u>

In connection with the 'World Aids Day 2021', the first year student teachers of Natural Science optional conducted an awareness programme on 1 December 2021. The programme started with a prayer. After that, Ms. Arya Sasi welcomed the gathering, highlighting the purpose and importance of celebrating 'World Aids Day'. This was followed by a paper presentation on Aids Awareness by Ms. Silpa S. With the support of a well framed PowerPoint presentation, she explained clearly about the disease, and the different ways in which it is spread. She emphasized the imperative need to change the attitude of the society towards the affected people. The pictures exhibited were really an eye-opener to the audience. She concluded the presentation with a message to get aloof from the disease rather than from the affected people. After that, the posters prepared by the students were presented and explained by Ms. Nayana S. and Mayookha S. Singh.

• <u>Awareness programme on National Pollution Prevention Day by Physical</u> <u>Science Association</u>

0 National Webinar on GENDER SENSITISATION ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN on 16 May 2022

The College Union 'Anwaya' of Sree Narayana Training College, in collaboration with all departments of college, organised a National Webinar series on eight different topics. The seminar series was officially inaugurated on 16 May 2022 at 6.00 pm in the Google Meet platform, by Dr. Jayaprakash R. K., Director, SCERT. He discussed the seriousness of the



topic and talked about the major issues faced by women in today's society. The resource person was Smt. Nileena Atholi, Sub-Editor, Mathrubhoomi. She discussed her own experiences as a media person related to the topic. The whole session uncovered the current situations in the society, and she cited relevant examples from day-to-day life. She talked about rape and murder of women, human trafficking, dowry deaths and forced early marriages. Her talk mainly dealt with contemporary problems. The session proved to be an eye-opener to the student teachers as it portrayed the rather unexplored facets in the lives of women.

National Webinar on FUNDAMENTAL ASPECTS OF CONSTITUTIONAL LAW on 19 May 2022

The webinar on 'Fundamental Aspects of Constitutional Law' in association with Centre for Constitutional Literacy, Chiranyinkeezhu was held on 19 May 2022 via Google Meet platform at 6.00 pm. The honourable principal Dr. Sheeba P and Dr. Viji V, Assistant Professor and Staff Advisor of Sree Narayana Training College, Nedunganda were the convenors of the seminar. The Resource Person Dr. Seema S. Dhar gave a general idea about the Indian Constitution like its characteristic features, structure, reason for being the lengthiest constitution in the world and its benefits, difference between Fundamental Rights, Human Rights and Statutory Rights etc. Then her talk focused on the Fundamental Rights mentioned in Article 12-35 of Part III of Indian Constitution and it is also called the Magna Carta of Indian Constitution. She talked about the six fundamental rights enshrined in the Constitution of India which are guaranteed to all citizens irrespective of race, religion, gender and are enforceable by the courts, subject to certain conditions. Throughout the seminar, she preferred to use the term 'stakeholders' instead of 'Government' to instil the power and wider aspects of the Constitution and Fundamental Rights.
