Introduction

Teaching practice is a key component of the teacher training programme. It is during this period that the student teacher gets to translate the skills and theory learnt into reality through actual classroom teaching. Teaching practice is the vital component of teacher education and training because it provides student teachers with an opportunity to learn from experience in the work place. During teaching practice student teachers get the practical experience of observing expert teachers, receiving feedback, and practising strategies are the most important factors in their growth as teachers. Training teachers is a partnership between teachers training colleges, the secondary schools and stakeholders in the education system. The Educational institutes send out teacher trainees to schools every year on school practice but School of Education does not clearly state how the secondary schools are expected to contribute to the training of these teacher trainees. School practice is a semester wise routine prescribed by teacher training colleges which have reflected on to assess its effectiveness in preparing teacher-trainees.

The main purpose for school practice is to provide opportunities to teacher trainees to put in practice pedagogical theories and skills while in schools.

The internship phase II programme at GVHSS, Njekkad brought out an opportunity to take part in the school programmes and sharing the responsibilities and duties with the teachers.

International moon day and science club inauguration



July 20, this year will mark the inaugural celebration of International Moon Day. The United Nations General Assembly, on December 9, 2021, recognized the proposal submitted by the Moon Village Association and several other groups within the organization. The application was submitted to the United Nations Office for Outer Space Affairs (UNOOSA).

The day will celebrate one of the most memorable moments in human history. On July 20, 1969, US astronauts Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin became the first humans to reach the lunar planet. It was the first time that a human had set foot on the Moon's surface.

Upon landing on the surface, with millions of eyes watching history being written, Neil Armstrong hopped down the ladder and said, **“That is one small step for a man, one giant leap for mankind.”**

Hence the moon day is on July 20, our school planned to celebrate it on July 21 in collaboration with the science club: **Thaarapadham Science Club**. On the same day science club inauguration was planned to be done. We created a video related to moon day celebration. It was planned to show that video on each classes at the high school level. For that we collected laptops of each class from the concerned class teacher. After that the video related to Monday was uploaded on each laptop. The video presentation was planned to be held on July 21st morning.

July 21: on July 21st morning, as part of the moon day celebration, UP students were there in front of the school gate with pluck cards related to moon day. Science club students made different models of moon, solar planet, chandraayaan, rockets, etc., and those were presented in front of the school building. Different charts containing quotes related to moon day also were made and presented.

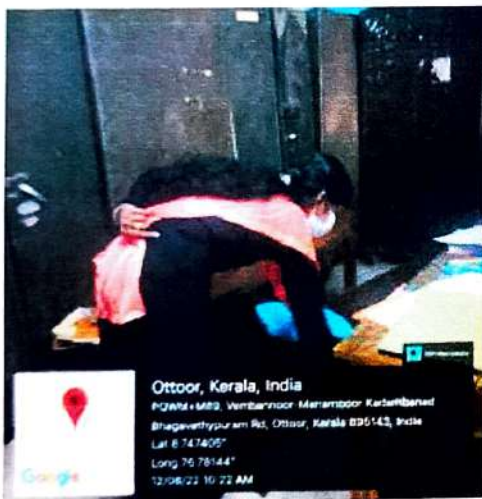
Library Cleaning

All of us participated in this programme. The programme lasted for about 1 hour. Students get so many knowledge about the importance of celebrating such days. It was a nice session.



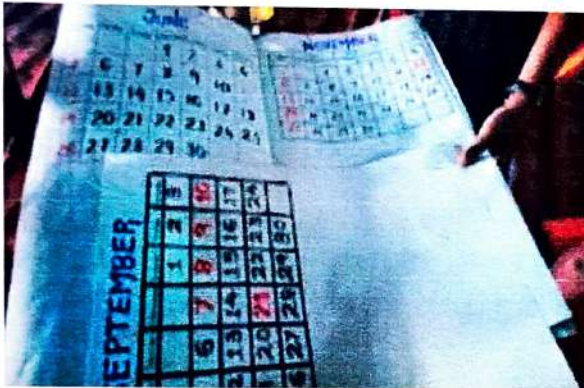
Preparation of Academic Calendar

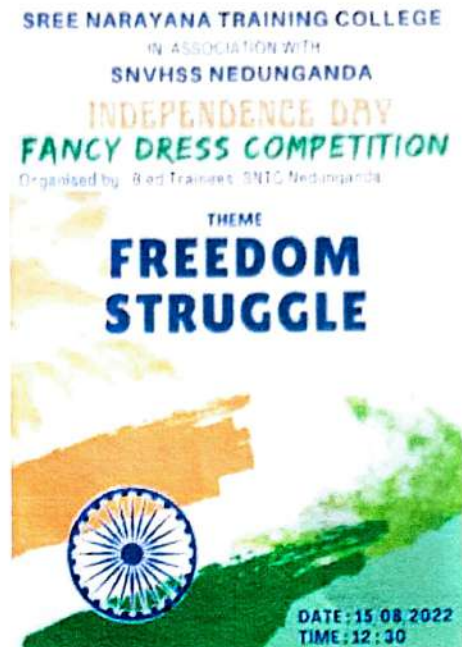

The Independence Day celebration of school began with the flag hoisting ceremony done by Santhosh N, Head Master of the school. Adding colour to the programme there was a parade show led



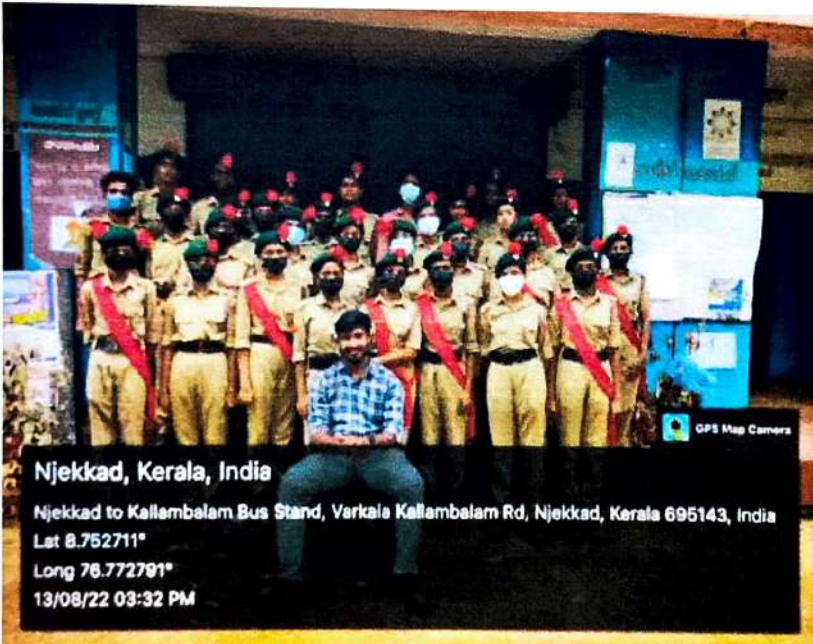

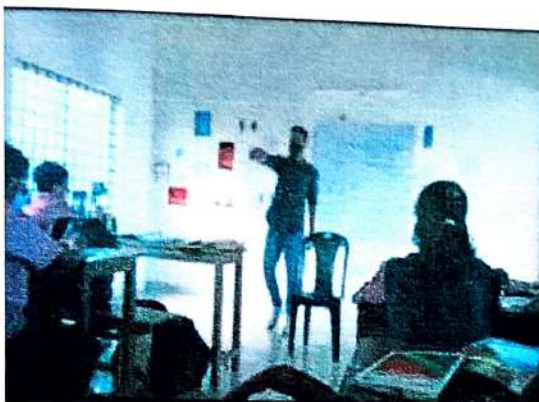




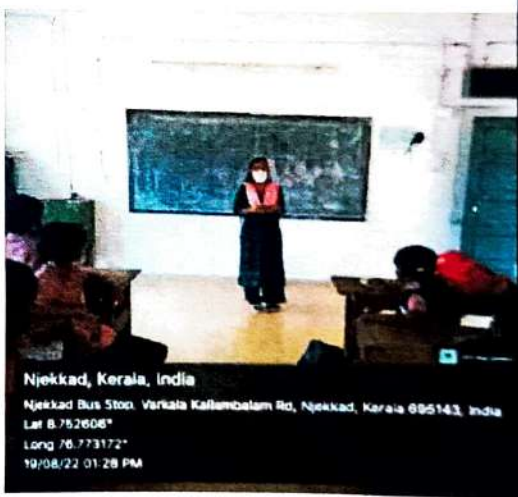
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Malala Day Observation

Then in the assembly, the club members conducted the various programs. The program was inaugurated by the HM of the school. First of all, the students were given an awareness about the importance of this day and announced as Malala Day. Then the importance of celebrating Malala Day was also mentioned by the students. ie,

July 12 is observed as International Malala Day to salute the Nobel Laureate Malala Yousafzai, who works for women's right to education across the globe and also became the international

symbol of the fight for girls' education. The 16-year-old Pakistani Activist Malala Yousafzai on July 12, 2013, delivered a moving speech at the headquarters of the United Nations. Her speech was focused on worldwide access to women's education and appealed the world leaders to bring changes to their policies. July 12 was designated as Malala Day by the United Nations to honor the young woman who has been advocating for female education for years. Malala Day 2022 provides an opportunity to world leaders to ensure compulsory and free education for every child.

The program was really a mind blowing one. Everyone who participated in it became a devotee of Malala. The thoughts and quotes of Malala were also discussed in this session. Also the struggle which Malala fought for women education were narrated by the students. And all these programs were conducted by the BEd trainees, including me.
