SCHOOL INDUCTION PROGRAMME



The sole purpose of Initiatory school experience is to provide student-teacher the opportunity to have primary experiences with the functioning of the school. Students of SNTC were sent to 11 different schools in the locality from 6/8/2017 to 11/8/2017. This school attachment program was for a period of five continuous working days giving them an opportunity to acquaint with the school environment and day-to-day functioning. Observation of lessons of senior teachers individually or in small groups (2 nos.), meeting the students informally to learn their background and interest learning, to see the learning facilities in the school, observing the social climate in the school. etc were some of the activities be undertaken during this period. DRUG AWARENESS PROGRAMME

SCHOOL INTERNSHIP



Internship in Teaching/School Internship is for a period of 20 weeks divided into two Phases of 12 and 8 weeks, organized during the Third and Fourth Semesters of the Course. School Internship/Teaching Practice for Semester III was arranged as a single block program for a duration of 12 weeks (one week preparatory work at school/college, 10 weeks of teaching in schools, one week post practice-teaching practical work at school/college). 18 students of English department were sent to different schools in the locality including GHSS Kadaikkavoor, **SSPBHSS** Kadaikkavoor. HSS SSV Chirayankeezh, Sivagiri HSS etc. Internship lasted from July to September.



Internship School cum apprenticeship /Teaching **Practice** for Semester IV was arranged as a single block program for a duration of 8 weeks (one week preparatory work at school/college, 6 weeks of teaching in schools, one week post practice-teaching practical work at school/college).Student-teachers took classes for students of VII to IX and participated in all actively activities of the school during this period.

ARTS DAY



Arts Day was conducted in the college for bringing out the creative spark in the students on the stage. Literary events like Story writing, Poetry writing, Essay writing were conducted. Painting and competitions drawing were also organised. The stage events were splendid including dance, music and recitation events. The competitions were held on the basis of Houses.

ONAM 2017




